



Third Party Alcohol Delivery

Changes to the Liquor License Regulations Allows the Delivery of Alcohol with Food.

New regulations come into effect today, March 1, 2023, involving all Licensees and their ability to deliver alcohol. Read the [Information for Licensees](#) for more information.

- Employees of a licensed establishment are can deliver alcohol with food on behalf of their employer.
- Third-party delivery personnel are now able to deliver alcoholic beverages with food from licensed establishments.
- If an individual is not an employee of a licensed establishment, in order to deliver alcohol with food an individual must hold a Delivery Person License issued by the Alcohol, Gaming, Fuel & Tobacco Division.
- Licensees must adhere to the regulatory requirements such as alcohol orders restricted to three times the value of the food ordered, except in the case of wine; ensure alcohol is not sold for takeaway or delivery with food before 10 am or after 10 pm, etc.
- Licensees are eligible to sell cocktails and house-made drinks for delivery and takeout.

Licensees who wish to sell mixed drinks for take-out or delivery must apply and receive authorization from the Executive Director of AGFT. This can be done by emailing AGFT's Manager of Licensing at: agdpermlicense@novascotia.ca.
